

Dear Friends...

A minister must ask permission from the Synod to 'sit down' (retire). I along with some others did so in March at Acomb Methodist Church. Revd Bill Anderson from Hornsea asked if I would share with you what I said in the five minutes given to me. It is below:

1982 I arrived as a Probationer presbyter in Gateshead. A rural lad finding myself during Margaret Thatcher's fight with the Miners where I was stationed and her demise of the Ship Building Industry: both left communities where I served distort, divided and in some cases destroyed, and many have never fully recovered. That was 42 years ago—I can remember it as if it were yesterday. Those years have flown by, and I have had during that time the privilege of serving in several Circuits and other appointments in the Church.

I recently watched the film MAESTRO, which tells of the complicated yet colourful life of Leonard Berstein—the amazingly gifted, talented musician, composer, conductor, and educationalist.

Berstein said several very important things about music, and I share very briefly 3 with you relating them to ministry:

I cannot live one day without hearing music, playing it, studying it or thinking about it: Worship has been fundamental to my ministry. To help to lead others into the conscious presence of God is both a great privilege and an awesome responsibility. Churches are worshipping communities and in worship, we orientate ourselves in the company of others to God who is the source of life, light, and salvation. The purpose of worship is the glorification of God and the sanctification of God's worshippers. There has not a day gone by in these 42 years where I have not been sustained by that privilege and been dependent upon it.

## I am not intent in having an orchestra sound like itself. I want it to sound like the composer.

I have lived a life of ministry with a love hate relationship with the church. I have loved its people but not always loved the institution. Our composer is God in Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit. To sound like the composer, BEING is paramount. I wish I had given it more time. Prayer is at the heart of that living relationship, a friendship in which God calls us to walk closely in communion with Him all the days of our lives. I once heard the great Archbishop Michael Ramsey tell the true story from his retirement, how a young Muslim from Bangladesh who kept the post office across the road where he used to buy stamps in Durham, came to visit him and asked how long he had been ordained. He said, 'nearly 60 years.' The young man said: 'That's a very long friendship' and Ramsey repeated that phrase more than once savouring its memory and smiling. I was privileged to hear him tell that story.

## I am worried about the future. About my children waking up and seeing on TV that black kids are still walking down the street—not begging for an inch but demanding a mile.

Social holiness has played a huge part in my ministry. From those very early days of standing alongside those miners on the outskirts of Gateshead, to the hill farmers of Cumbria, being exploited by bad government policies to the individual vulnerable members of the congregations and communities I have tried to serve. For me people have mattered. I do hope that in the past 42 years love has been unconditional, freely given and freely received. And the love which issues in pastoral care is probably the most effective long term evangelistic weapon which the church possesses.

With those few rambling thoughts strung together I ask permission of synod to sit down.
