





THE LORD WILL INDEED GIVE WHAT IS GOOD, AND OUR LAND WILL YIELD ITS HARVEST PSALM 85:12

Dear Friends...

Leading any organisation demands teamwork. Working together demands multiple skills. However, in ministry the foundation of working together as colleagues is mutual commitment to one another of loyalty, respect, and love. The Bible calls this kind of commitment a covenant: a solemn, life shaping agreement.

One of the greatest studies of this kind in the Bible is the book of Ruth. At first reading it can seem to be rather a domesticated story, sandwiched between the great historical narratives of Joshua and Samuel. We move from the vast sweep of history and the clashes of nations to the affairs of a single family.

Ruth does tell the story of one extended family at a particular moment in their lives: the key action of the book takes place over a few months. The characters are caught up in the dramas of their day but they are not in any sense leaders: they are not prophets or kings. Prelists or queens. But the Book of Ruth is entirely focused on leadership and the foundation of leadership.

Remember how Ruth joins herself to Naomi and to the people of God in one of the greatest moments of the whole drama of the OT:

'Do not press me to leave you or to turn back from following you! Where you go, I will go; where you lodge, I will lodge; your people shall be my people, and your God my God.

Where you die, I will die, there I will be buried. May the Lord do this and so to me and more as well, if even death parts me from you' (Ruth 1 v16–17) Ruth makes a covenant–a solemn promise and vow of loyalty which will shape her life from this day forwards. The covenant made by Ruth is both risky and sacrificial. It would be the safer course for Ruth to remain with her kindred in Moab than risk a long journey and a life of poverty with her mother–in–law in a foreign land. These were dangerous times to be without security and protection.

Yet these women are immeasurably stronger because of their commitment and friendship, their covenant across the generations. Together they begin to have the strength and resources to reshape their lives and to shape the world. Naomi offers to Ruth her wisdom, advice, and wider network of friends. Ruth offers to Naomi her loyalty and love, her labour, and her trust. Naomi's life seems to have come to an end. Ruth is a stranger and a migrant. Yet the alliance between them creates possibilities of resilience and change. They are colleagues in the rebuilding of their lives, their home, and their family. Naomi's wisdom and Ruth's courage combine with the generosity and good ness of Boaz to set a new and strong foundation for what will become the House of Jesse and the line of Israel's kings.

Why share with you this story at the beginning of the Methodist new year? Because the story carries many lessons in leadership: and we are all Leaders in the life of the Church. The story helps us to see the value of forming and sustaining different kinds of strong relationships which lie at the heart of every common endeavour and certainly lies at the heart of good and mature leadership.
